Structure 101

Serious structural problems in houses are not very common, but when they occur they can be difficult & costly to repair.

These tips won't turn you into a home inspector, but it will give you some of the common indicators of structural concerns.



Tip 1 - Leaning House


"You're going to love this place..."



Take a macro-look at the home from across the street




Tip 1 - Leaning House





Tip 2 – Exterior Walls & Entries

 Look for areas of wall separation greater than ½" in size










Tip 2 – Exterior Walls & Entries

 Is the chimney separating from the home?









Tip 3 – Doors & Windows

Let's just step inside...





Tip 3 – Doors & Windows










Tip 4 -Floors & Walls

- Drywall cracks > ¼"
- Uneven floors near corners










Tip 5 - Basement Foundation Crack

 Look for significant cracks both inside and outside on the foundation




Tip 5 - Basement Foundation Crack





Tip 5 - Basement Foundation Crack

 Some foundation flaws are not indications of structural issues, but are construction defects.





Summary

- Tip1 Is the house obviously leaning?
- Tip 2 Are there large external cracks?
- Tip 3 Are doors & windows sticking?
- Tip 4 Are walls cracked or floors uneven?
- Tip 5 Are there basement cracks present?

Any of these may indicate a structural issue that should be inspected or reviewed
